A few of Paul's final words (1 Timothy 1:15-17)

- 1. Look up each of the 5 faithful/trustworthy sayings (1 Tim 1:15, 1 Tim 3:1, 1 Tim 4:7-9, 2 Tim 2:11 and Titus 3:8). When you consider to whom these letters were written, what should we understand by this phrase?
- 2. How is it refreshing to come aside from the world and open the Scriptures to consider something that is "trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance"?
- 3. Try not to skim over the words "Christ Jesus came into the world". This is the great central theme of the whole Scriptures. Consider and discuss:
  - a. Where did Christ come from?
  - b. What kind of place did Christ come to?
  - c. When Christ came from heaven to earth, did He become any less God than before?
- 4. What was does Paul say was the purpose of Christ coming into the world? Refer also to Matthew 1:21. In as simple language as you can, how would you explain this to an unbeliever?
- 5. What proof does Paul offer for this? How is Paul an encouraging "example" for us?
- 6. In what way is Paul an example to us of Jesus displaying His perfect patience? How is that helpful when we doubt the patience and long-suffering of God toward us?
- 7. What is striking about Paul's precise language at the end of v15? How can this encourage believers who increasingly despair about their sense of sin?
- 8. Read aloud and soak in Paul's doxology in v17. How is this a fitting response not only to this trustworthy saying but this entire series in "The Life of Paul"?
